RECOMMENDATIONS FOR disposible THE TRADE IN SPECIES LISTED IN THE CITES APPENDICES

Preamble

This pamphlet is partly based on the *ATIBT initiative to support the 'commercialisation of African species listed in Appendix 'II of CITES*¹.

This document was drawn up following the 19th Conference of the Parties to the *Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora* (CITES²), held in Panama in November 2022³. At this conference, a new series of commonly traded wood species⁴ was included in Appendix II of CITES, with major consequences for their exploitation and trade, particularly internationally.

1. DEFINITION AND ROLE OF CITES

CITES⁵, also known as the *Washington Convention*, is an international agreement between governments.

Its aim is to ensure that international trade in specimens of wild animals and plants does not threaten the survival of the species. Species covered by CITES are listed in one of **three Convention Appendices** according to the level of protection required.

Any importing, exporting or re-exporting (exporting of an imported specimen) of specimens of species covered by the Convention must be authorised under a **permit system**.

2. THE THREE CITES APPENDICES

Appendices I, II and III to the Convention are lists of species afforded different levels or types of protection from overexploitation⁶.




- * **Appendix I** lists species threatened with extinction. Exports and imports of specimens of these species are prohibited except in exceptional circumstances, for example for scientific research.
- * **Appendix II** lists species that are not necessarily threatened with extinction, but whose trade must be regulated to avoid exploitation incompatible with their survival.

In particular, the wood species listed in this Appendix are annotated with the symbol #

followed by a number to indicate that only specific parts and derivatives are covered, as indicated in the corresponding footer. In the case of wood, this is most often symbol #17, which indicates that *logs, sawn wood, veneer sheets, plywood and transformed wood* are covered.

* **Appendix III** lists species protected by a country that has asked the other parties to the Convention for assistance in controlling exports.

3. MARKETING OF SPECIES LISTED IN CITES APPENDIX II

International trade in tropical timber is mainly affected by the inclusion in **Appendix II** of key, commonly traded species⁷, mainly Afrormosia, Bubinga, Cedro, Mahogany, Ramin, and since 2023, Doussié, Padouk, Acajou d'Afrique (African Mahogany)⁸, Ipê and Cumaru.⁹

International trade in these species is covered by:

- **1. An export permit or re-export certificate** issued by the Management Authority of the exporting or re-exporting country:
- Export permits are only issued if the specimen has been obtained legally and if the export will not be detrimental to the survival of the species.
- The re-export certificate is only issued if the specimen has been imported in accordance with the provisions of the Convention.
- 2. An import permit if required by national law. For EU member countries, an import permit issued by the Member State is required for imports of species listed in CITES Appendix II. This import permit is in addition to the CITES export permit or CITES re-export certificate (issued by the third country).

4. DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CITES APPENDIX AND EU ANNEX LISTINGS

The Member States of the European Union do not apply CITES as it stands, but they do have regulations that harmonise and strengthen its application within the EU.

All species listed in CITES (Appendices I, II and III) are included, depending on the applicable level of protection, in one of the four annexes (A, B, C and D) to *Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 of 9 December 1996 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein*¹⁰, which mentions:

* Annex A shall contain:

- (a) the species listed in Appendix I to the Convention for which the Member States have not entered a reservation;
- (b) any species:
 - (i) which is, or may be, in demand for utilization in the Community or for international trade and which is either threatened with extinction or so rare that any level of trade would imperil the survival of the species; or
 - (ii) which is in a genus of which most of the species or which is a species of which most of the subspecies are listed in Annex A and whose listing in the Annex is essential for the effective protection of those taxa.

7. The only truly "commercial" species listed in CITES Appendix I is the Rio Rosewood.

- In 2023, no commercial species will be listed in Appendix III.
- 8. Entry into effect on 23 February 2023.
- **9.** Entry into effect on 23 November 2024.

The two groups of "precious" species, Rosewood and Madagascar Ebony, can be added to this list of commercial species classified in Appendix II.

* Annex B shall contain:

- (a) the species listed in Appendix II to the Convention, other than those listed in Annex A, for which the Member States have not entered a reservation;
- (b) the species listed in Appendix I to the Convention for which a reservation has been entered;
- (c) any other species not listed in Appendices I or II to the Convention:
 - (i) which is subject to levels of international trade that might not be compatible with its survival or with the survival of populations in certain countries, or with the maintenance of the total population at a level consistent with the role of the species in the ecosystems in which it occurs; or
 - (ii) whose listing in the Annex for reasons of similarity in appearance to other species listed in Annex A or Annex B, is essential in order to ensure the effectiveness of controls on trade in specimens of such species;

(d) species in relation to which it has been established that the introduction of live specimens into the natural habitat of the Community would constitute an ecological threat to wide species of fauna and flora indigenous to the Community.

* Annex C shall contain:

- (a) the species listed in Appendix III to the Convention, other than those listed in Annexes A or B, for which the Member States have not entered a reservation;
- (b) the species listed in Appendix II to the Convention for which a reservation has been entered.

* Appendix D shall contain:

- (a) species not listed in Annexes A to C which are imported into the Community in such numbers as to warrant monitoring;
- (b) the species listed in Appendix III to the Convention for which a reservation has been entered.

5. NON-DETRIMENT FINDINGS (NDFS)

A Non-Detriment Finding (NDF)¹¹ is a vital tool in the trade and conservation of species listed in the CITES Appendices.

CITES states that a Non-Detriment Finding must be carried out before any permit for trade can be issued. This is a science-based study that assesses whether any trade will have a negative (or detrimental) effect on the survival of that species. In addition, it looks at whether or not such trade would allow populations of the specific species to be maintained, throughout its range and at a level "consistent with its role in the ecosystems in which it occurs". NDFs are drawn up by the Scientific Authority in each country¹².

Private concerns, mainly forestry companies, can contribute to NDFs, in particular by making inventory data available to enable a better characterisation of the resource. The results of these inventories can be used to draw up export quotas.

6. EXPORT QUOTAS

Before any Party may issue a permit to allow export of specimens of species in Appendix I or II, its Scientific Authority must advise that that the proposed export will not be detrimental to the survival of the species.

Unless otherwise stated, the quotas established represent the maximum number of specimens of wild origin that are authorised for export during the current calendar year (January to December)¹³.

Exporting and importing countries share responsibility for ensuring that export quotas are respected.

Monitoring is the responsibility of the CITES Management Authority of each country¹⁴.

In Central African countries, "Annual Felling Plots" (*Assiettes annuelles de coupe, AAC*) remain legally open for several years (two to three years).

In its annex Guidelines for management of nationally established export quotas¹⁵, Conf. 14.7 Management of nationally established export quotas states that **as far as possible the period covered by an export quota should be the calendar year** (i.e. 1 January to 31 December) and that if a Party establishes an annual export quota for a period other than a calendar year, it should indicate the period to which the quota applies when communicating it to the Secretariat.

7. EXPORT PERMIT

An export permit is an official document issued by a Management Authority of a Party to authorise the export of specimens of species listed in Appendix I or II, or the export of specimens of species listed in Appendix III from the State that requested the listing.

Permits must comply with the provisions of the Convention and the Resolutions of the Conference of the Parties in order to be valid.

A CITES export permit is compulsory when the species concerned are listed in one of the three Appendices to the Convention.

An export permit or re-export certificate is issued by the Management Authority of the exporting or re-exporting country. The export permit is only issued if the specimen was obtained legally.

Export permits and re-export certificates are valid for a maximum of six months, within which time the export and corresponding import into the country of destination must take place (see examples of export and import permits at the end of the document).

8. IMPORT PERMIT

A CITES import permit is a document required to import a specimen from a third country.

In the European Union, this document is required to import alive or dead animal or plant (or a part or derivative thereof) of a species listed in Annexes A or B of the Regulation from a third country.

The import permit can only be issued if a copy of the exporting country's CITES permit has been attached to the application.

Each country is free to impose a CITES import permit or not.

For EU member countries, an import permit issued by the Member State is required for imports of species listed in CITES Appendix II. This import permit is in addition to the CITES export permit or CITES re-export certificate (issued by the third country).

The import permit is issued by the Management Authority of the importing country. **The import permit can only be issued if a copy of the exporting country's CITES permit has been attached to the application.**

When the specimen leaves the country of origin outside the EU, the original foreign export permit or re-export certificate must be presented to the customs office of exit in that third country.

If it is a species listed in Annex A or Annex B of Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97, the importer must also present the three original sheets (grey, yellow and green) of the corresponding EU import permit, which must be obtained prior to shipment of the specimens on the basis of a copy of the above-mentioned foreign CITES (re-) export document.

The customs authorities at the point of entry of the specimen into the European Union will then endorse the grey, yellow and green sheets of the EU import permit in box 27 and notify the actual quantities imported.

Customs will then send the original foreign export permit (or re-export certificate) and the grey and green copies of the import permit to the Management Authority that issued the import permit.

They return the yellow copy of the import permit, duly completed in box 27 and signed off, to the operator. This yellow sheet must be kept safe by the importer (and not by the forwarder or agent) as it is then considered proof of legal importation.

This yellow slip certifies that the import is legal only if it is duly completed and signed off by customs in box 27.

CITES Authorities in European countries encourage exporters to provide all documents (management plan, annual operations plan, mapping of annual felling plots, etc. by WeTransfer) needed to certify the sustainable and legal origin of imported timber, in order to reduce the time taken to process import permit applications.

Import permits may be valid for up to 12 months.

Several species of wood may be grouped together when applying for a CITES import permit, provided that it is a single consignment, originating from one exporter and destined for one importer.

9. RE-EXPORTS

Re-exports apply to all exports of imported species:

- For species covered by Appendix I: the re-export certificate is only issued if the species has been imported in accordance with the provisions of the Convention and, in the case of live plants or animals, if an import permit has been issued.
- For species covered by Appendix II: the re-export certificate is only issued if the specimen has been imported in accordance with the provisions of the Convention.
- For species covered by Appendix III: the re-export certificate issued by the country of re-export is required.
